Can I use my backyard boundary fence as a pool fence?

Your backyard fence, or a nearby barrier, can become the boundary of your pool, so long as the structure meets council regulations.

In some cases, pool boundaries can be a combination of both backyard fences and other nearby barriers, if they are deemed suitable according to local guidelines.

STEP 1

CHECK YOUR LOCAL POOL FENCE REGULATIONS

Your first step to pool safety is to familiarise yourself with local pool fence regulations.

If you're not sure what they are, it's important to contact your local council. To make it easy for you, we've listed the best point of contact for each Australian state and territory below.

STEP 2

ASSESS ALL FENCES IN YOUR BACKYARD

If your backyard's boundary fences are near or next to your pool, you will need to assess their position and dimensions to make sure they are up to standard.

All boundaries in close proximity to your pool must meet local council pool fence regulation requirements.

Once you've taken note of all boundaries near or next to your pool, it's time to take some measurements.



STEP 3

TAKE MEASUREMENTS OF YOUR BACKYARD BOUNDARIES

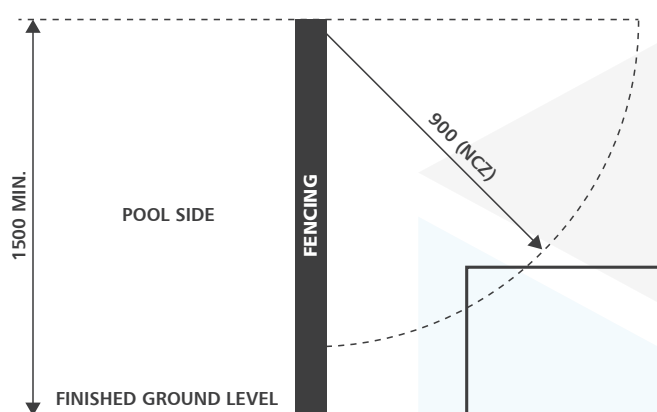


To make sure all boundaries in close proximity to your pool are up to standard, it's important to take accurate measurements. When it comes to getting your pool fence right, guessing is not an option.

What is the first measurement I should take?

Measure all structures or boundaries that would enable someone to climb on the inside or outside of your pool fence.

Ask yourself: do these structures or boundaries measure within 900mm from the top of my pool fence?



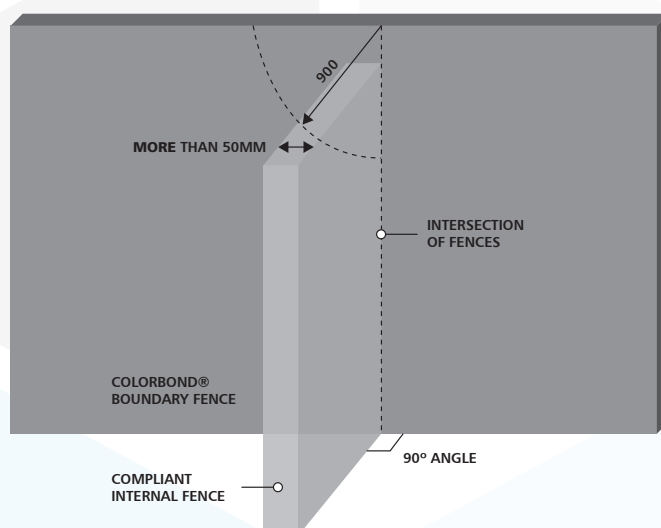
Refer to page 9 for Examples of boundaries that meet pool fence regulation standards.

NCZ stands for Non-Climbable Zone which is a Pool Safety Term, it is a requirement that there is to be nothing to climb on within a 900mm Radius of the top of the fence.

What is the second measurement I should take?

Next, you need to measure the intersections of any internal fences that intersect with the boundary fence.

Do these internal fences have a top rail surface width of more than 50mm?



If you responded yes to either of these questions when taking your measurements, you will need to extend the height of your pool fence.

If you do not extend the height of your pool fence, your pool area will not be in line with pool fence regulations. Not only will this put you at risk of being fined, it may also place you and your loved ones at risk.

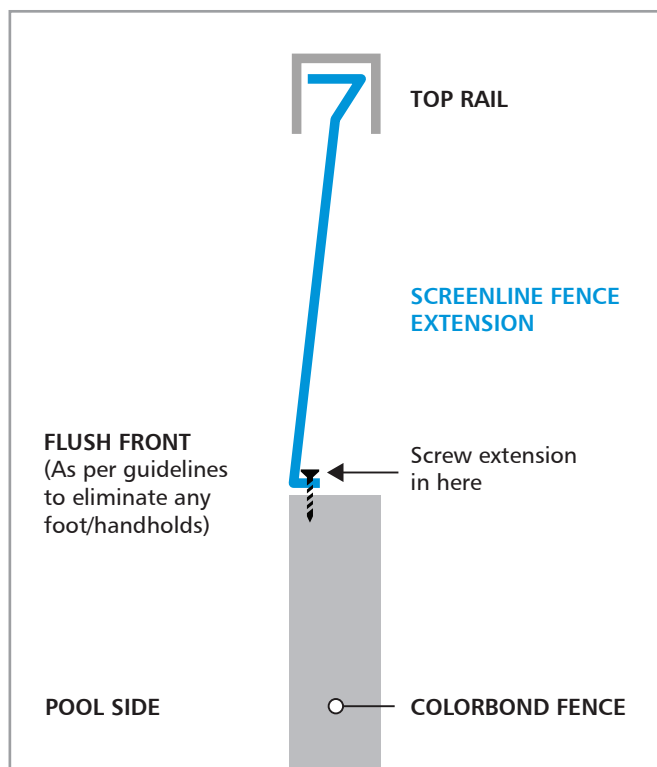
STEP 4

EXTEND THE HEIGHT OF YOUR POOL FENCE

Once you've ordered our 6-step DIY fence extension kit (refer to page 8 for more information), it's time to extend the height of your pool fence using our fence extensions.

You can install your fence extensions in either traditional slat or privacy style, depending on your preference.

To ensure your fence extensions are installed correctly, refer to the diagram below:

CHECK YOUR WORK AND GET CERTIFIED

How will I know if I've installed my fence extensions properly?

It may be tempting to skip this step, but it's important to check your work to make sure your fence is up to standard.

There's no point calling your local certifier if you're presenting them with a fence that can't be certified.

How do I get my pool fence certified?

Your newly-extended pool fence will require certification following the installation of your fence extensions.

Not only will certification deliver peace of mind, proper documentation may also be required to make sure you're insured.

To get your pool fence certified, contact your local private certifier.

By following these easy steps to install your fence extensions correctly, you can rest assured knowing your pool fence meets all council regulations.

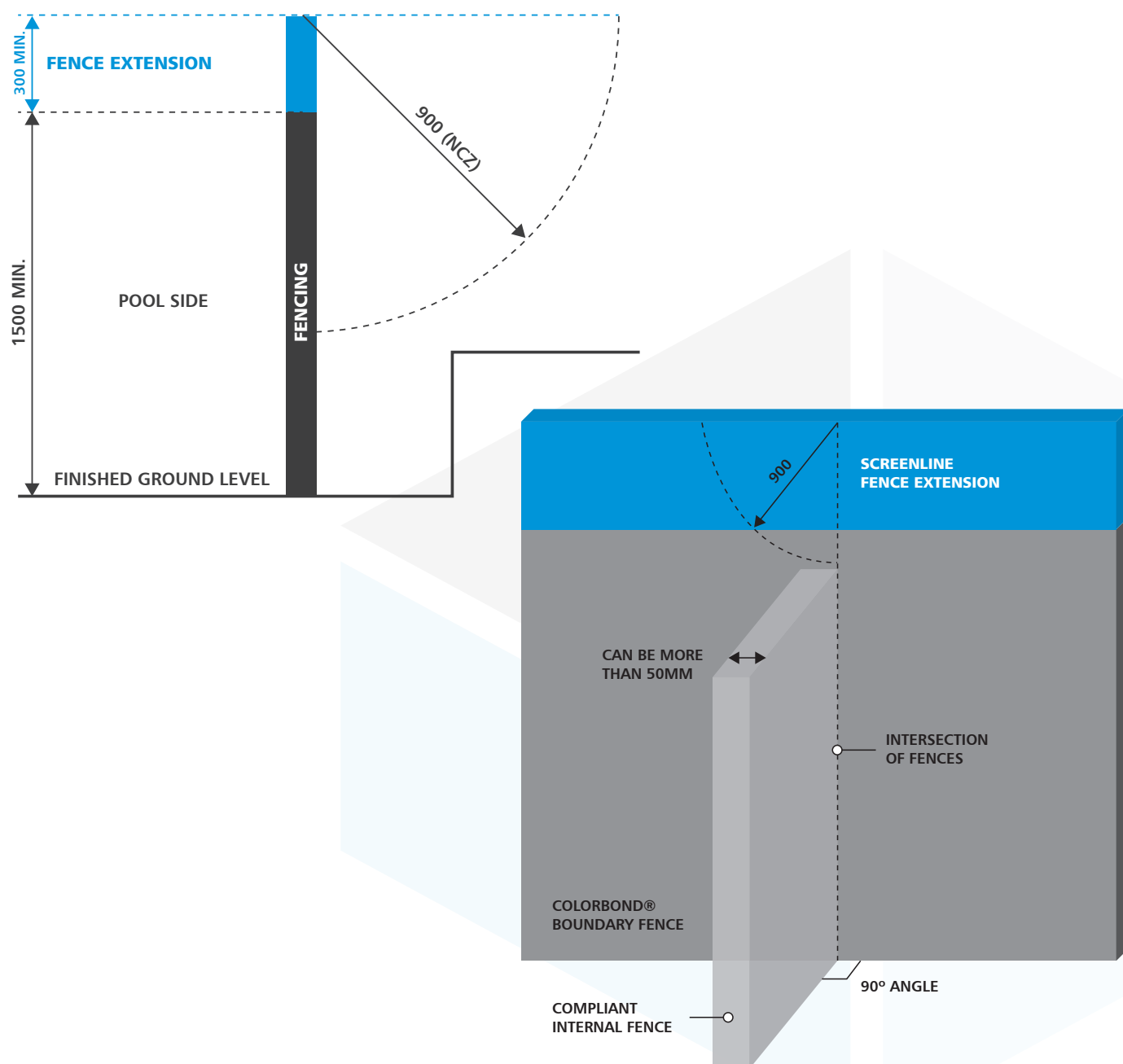
